### Understanding Te Tiriti o Waitangi | One day workshop

**How can we understand Te Tiriti o Waitangi (the Treaty) and its history in today's context, and how might we apply this understanding to our daily life?**

Find out about the history of Te Tiriti—why it was written, what it says, and how we got to be where we are today. Use this knowledge to help make sense of current relationships and politics and to explore where you stand.

**CONTENT:** This engaging introductory workshop is suitable for people with all levels of background knowledge. It covers:

An afternoon of training for **staff, managers and leaders** of community organisations.

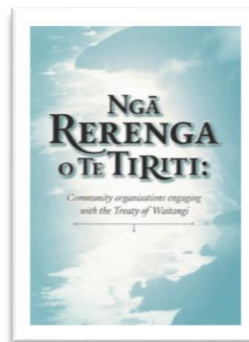
**WHEN:** (tbc) September 2019, 1-4pm
